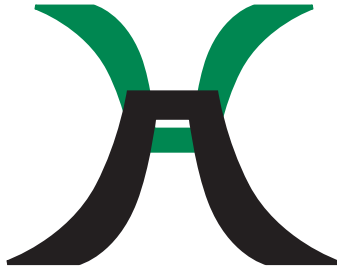

We provide students with opportunities to succeed in higher education, careers, and life.



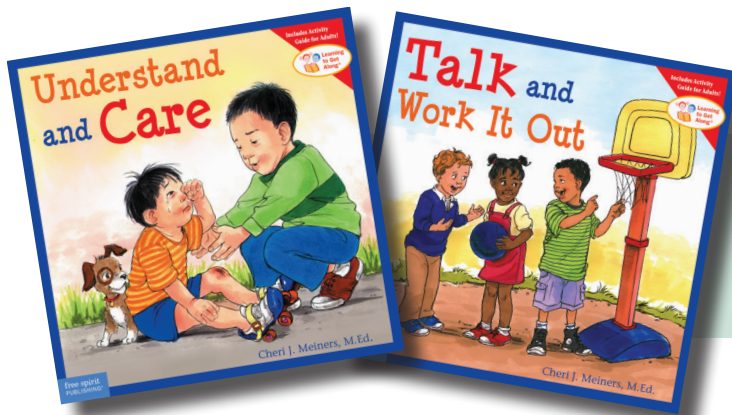
Social Responsibility
